Independent Courses (*there is strict criteria for these classes & instructor approval is required*)

Graduation Requirements:

- **28 credits**
 - **English** – 4 units
 - **Social Science** – 3 units consisting of: World Civilization, US History, American Government, Consumer Education
 - **Mathematics** – 3 units
 - **Science** – 3 units consisting of 1 unit of lab
 - **Health** – ½ unit
 - **PE** – 4 units
 - **Computers** – 1 unit
 - **Vocational/Fine Arts** – 2 units chosen from: Art, Music, Foreign Language, Vocational Ed. (1 unit must come from VocEd)
- ***Completion of: Federal & Illinois Constitutions, 30 hours of classroom instruction in Traffic Safety, and the PSAE

***College-Bound Students**

- Plan to take SSSI, SSSII, &/or SSSIII to fulfill the college Social Science requirement.
- Plan to take at least one mathematics course &/or one science course during your senior year (depending on your career choice). **Rigorous curriculum helps you prepare for your college experience.**
- **MAKE SURE** your course selection helps you meet the admission requirements for the college you plan to attend.
- In order to be successful at the college level it is recommended that you have taken math classes through Algebra II (minimum).
- Other classes for consideration are Speech and upper-level classes within your intended career area.

***WACC Students**

- Your WACC application is due in the Counseling Office by 3:15 on Friday, February 6th. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** This should be filled out like a job application, neatly and accurately. Be sure to list a 1st AND 2nd choice.
- You will be required to attend Early Bird PE every morning 7:20-8:00. Transportation to this class is NOT provided by the District.
- **Criteria for Attending WACC:** *The student must...*
 - Maintain a 3.0/5.0 overall GPA
 - Not have missed more than 10 days in a previous school calendar year
 - Have counselor, administration, and teacher recommendation
