

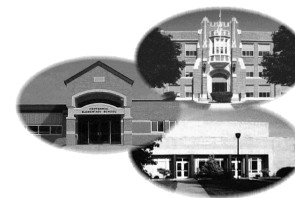

Department of Public Health Adopts Changes for Immunization Requirement

Recently, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) amended its rules to comply with recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) for providing increased protection for infants against pertussis disease. Specifically, the ACIP recommends that a dose of combined Tetanus/Diphtheria/acellular Pertussis vaccine (Tdap) be administered at 11 to 12 years of age.

Simply stated, this requires that all students entering **sixth grade and up through twelfth grade** in August of this year must have a Tdap booster or have on record in their health file, a date that they have already had one **before school begins**. After going through all high school health records, all students there are ok with this requirement. I will be sending home a letter to parents of 5th–8th grade students who need to get this booster. A few of the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students had this booster at the time of their sixth grade physical. Some pediatricians had already begun to follow the recommendations. Once you get the Tdap immunization for your child, you will need to send documentation to the school.

TO ALL ADULTS: Have you had this vaccine? This is important for you as well. It is most important if you will be around any infants. Ask your doctor if you should have a Tdap booster.
