2012/2013 Registration

Initial pre-registration information will be posted to the Polo School District website during the week of January 23rd. Please access information through the PCHS Guidance links. Included will be a copy of the PCHS Course Description Book, PCHS graduation requirements, and an expected timeframe for the registration process.

The materials for initial registration will be distributed to all PCHS students during the week of February 6th. Registration appointments will be listed outside the Counseling Office beginning the week of February 13th. Parents are encouraged to attend these registration appointments as it is important for the school and family to work together to ensure student success. Please refer to the PCHS daily announcements on the PCHS website in January and February for more specific registration information as well as appointment dates and deadlines.

Additional Counseling Office Information

Sophomores

A representative from Whiteside Area Career Center was at PCHS in December. During this time, interested students were given information on WACC’s programs as well as possible opportunities for Dual Credit through SVCC and Highland Community College. The sophomores will also have an opportunity to tour WACC during January or February. An announcement will be made and a sign-up will be posted outside the Counseling Office prior to the visit.

Juniors

Juniors will be taking the state mandated PSAE on April 24th and 25th. It is never too early to prepare students for this series of exams. PCHS students have workbooks, handheld tutors, and additional classroom lessons available to them. Parents and students can also take a proactive approach to this testing through personal computer programs, online practice tests, and additional texts that can be purchased at most book stores. There are several “outside” scholarships available in the PCHS Counseling Office at this time, including the 2012 Illinois General Assembly Scholarship sponsored by Representative Jerry Mitchell. Local scholarships will become available in the Counseling Office in early March.

FACS Class News

All of the Family and Consumer Science classes have been busy this semester learning skills they will use the rest of their lives.

The Orientation to FACS classes began the year studying basic nutrition. If you haven't heard, the USDA scrapped the food pyramid and replaced it with MyPlate. MyPlate uses a dinner plate divided into sections for serving sizes. We learned that by using a 9-inch plate divided into individual sections for fruit, vegetables, protein and grain, we would be healthier and also might lose weight. A couple of weeks ago we moved into the sewing and textiles unit. Students will make a chef's apron and a pair of boxers as part of this unit.

Introduction to Nutrition and Introduction to Textiles built on the skills they learned in the orientation class. Nutrition students explored making fast, nutritious meals that were low-cost. Students discovered it is possible to cook nutritious meals at home that are easy to make, delicious and affordable. Textile students worked on individual projects; students chose to make quilts, pillows, stuffed animals, and clothing. All of the projects turned out amazing!

Polo's 2nd Graders Participate in The Great Bedtime Story Pajama Drive

Centennial's second graders participated in The Great Bedtime Story Pajama Drive this year. Scholastic Book Clubs and the nonprofit Pajama Program sponsored the pajama drive. The mission of the drive is to provide children, ranging in age from newborn to 18, in need with brand-new pajamas and books. Since it began, the organization has provided 880,000 new pajamas and new books to children across the country. The program serves children living in group homes and shelters. Most have never enjoyed the simple comfort of having a parent tuck them in at bedtime with warm, clean pajamas and a story.

Mrs. Lahti's and Ms. Wolfley's second graders were very eager to help these children in need. As part of their money unit in math, they collected spare change to put toward purchasing pajamas to donate to the Pajama Drive. They were excited to count the coins and bills in the collection jar each day. The two classes even became competitive; at the end of each day they were checking to see what the other class had as a total! Some of the students even asked family members and relatives at Thanksgiving dinner to donate some money! Others checked the couch cushions, cleaned under the seats in the car, and even emptied their own piggy banks. After three weeks, the second graders collected a grand total of \$411.39! Seventy-nine pairs of PJs were purchased and donated to the Children's Home and Aid in Rockford, Illinois. Now those children can have the gift of a good night's sleep and a sweet bedtime story.

The second grade students learned a valuable lesson about giving this holiday season. They felt good knowing they were helping out other children who didn't have the necessities they had.

2. Turn the oven on to 55 degrees.
3. Shape the gingerbread man on the pan.
4. Use the sugar glaze to give him clothes.
5. Use the raisins to make the eyes, nose, mouth, and buttons.
6. Put him in the oven for 17 minutes.
7. When the timer goes off, be ready to catch him with a net.
8. Eat him!

"Stuff so does not stick to the pan"	

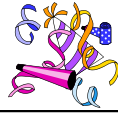
Recipe:

10. Take him apart and share him!


